## **Advent and Christmas**

## Join with as we anticipate and celebrate the Birth of Jesus Christ

#### It's Advent!

## How did that happen so soon? And what does it mean for our church?

Advent is a time of preparation and waiting. And, if you're anything like me, you've always thought of it as a waiting time for Christmas. "Why, then," you might ask, "are the Scripture lessons so dark and apocalyptic?" Here is some insight from Tish Harrison Warren. Ms. Warren is a priest in the Anglican Church in North America:

In the church calendar, every period of celebration is preceded by a time of preparation. Historically, Advent, the liturgical season that begins four Sundays before Christmas Day, is a way to prepare our hearts (and minds and souls) for Christmas. For Christians, Christmas is a celebration of Jesus' birth — that light has come into darkness and, as the Gospel of John says, "the darkness could not overcome it." But Advent bids us first to pause and to look, with complete honesty, at that darkness.

To practice Advent is to lean into an almost cosmic ache: our deep, wordless desire for things to be made right and the incompleteness we find in the meantime. We dwell in a world still racked with conflict, violence, suffering, darkness. Advent holds space for our grief, and it reminds us that all of us, in one way or another, are not only wounded by the evil in the world but are also wielders of it, contributing our own moments of unkindness or impatience or selfishness.

To think about Advent in these terms is to consider the promise that in the darkest of our times, Jesus will return to set things right. Thus, Advent becomes a time of waiting not only for the baby Jesus to be born into our world, but also for Jesus the Messiah to return to it in glory. Before his death, Jesus warns us to "keep watch," so in the meantime, we must practice the love he demands of us so we can manifest it in our Advent waiting and all the days that follow.

The choir will sing at the 9:00 p.m. service, which will feature readings of the Christmas story and passing the candlelight throughout the sanctuary while singing "Silent Night." On December 3rd, 10th, and 17th, we invite you to bring a gift of an unwrapped toy or a store gift card to place under the Christmas tree in the sanctuary during the first hymn. This honors our commitment to giving gifts as we await the greatest gift of all, the birth of Jesus.




# Christmas Flowers and Giving

## Moderator's Message

Psalm 1:3 They are like trees planted by the streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season, and their leaves do not wither. In all that they do, they prosper.

One of my practices, as the year winds down, is to take stock and review goals I may have established at the onset of the New Year. I dare say that many of you likely do the same. Well, I am happy to report that I lost a few pounds and have managed to keep them off during the year! As Kate often tells me, however, it's not always about me. To support that premise and to look

outside of myself this year, I also envisioned what I hoped would be achievable goals for our church family that would strengthen our community presence, and build a solid foundation for our future. As fate would have it, we were presented with our first obstacle; the resignation of Rev. Phil Hobson. This could have easily immobilized us from the start. As it turned out, however, while this was a

significant blow, it proved to be a unifying event. It initiated several activities that set us on the path to wholeness as a congregation, and to answer the call to bring the Good News to all. God certainly works in mysterious ways.

Immediate action was taken by Council. The Minister Search Committee was formed and without delay, meetings began even before Rev. Phil's departure. The committee moved along quite well creating the Local Church Profile until the second obstacle was encountered; funding the salary and benefits for our next minister. We could no longer support a full-time minister and after many discussions, it came to a congregational vote that resulted in the decision to pursue a part-time minister. This completed the Local Church Profile which will be sent to the NY UCC conference this week for review/approval to post the position.

Additionally, the Game Changer team was formed to improve how we communicate with the communities we serve. The results? Great turnouts for the Steeple Showcase season performances, increased Red Barn visitors, a successful grief support group series, a special "Blessings" retreat day, great support for partnership activities with the Suffolk County 6<sup>th</sup> Pre-

cinct, and who will ever forget the fabulous Holiday Bazaar that brought the community to our wonderful church home. As a side benefit to these successful activities, income to the church's general fund was achieved.

An additional two teams were created. The Strategic Planning Action Team will begin looking at opportunities to generate income with the intention of moving towards a full-time minister and to sup-

port church mission activities. And the newly formed Church Communication & Technology Team is making significant progress with our media presence, critical in this day and age.

How did all this happen!? I can unequivocally say that the Spirit is alive and well at Mt. Sinai Congregational Church. The Spirit within each of us prompted action, and that action has brought new life and the prospect of a bright future with untold success stories. I am so proud to be a part of this thriving community. May God bless and guide us through the power of the Holy Spirit as we begin the next year of our journey.


