Maundy Thursday, March 28

Having decided to forego a worship service, the Worship Board is offering information about a Maundy Thursday Service of Shadows you can do at home. Please see information about it elsewhere in this issue of the "Old Man's News."

Good Friday, March 29

Visit the sanctuary at any time between the hours of Noon and 3:00 p.m. for a spiritual journey along the Stations of the Cross.

Easter Morning - Sunrise, March 31

At 6:00 a.m., we'll gather at Cedar Beach for an Easter Sunrise Service to rejoice in the dawn of new life in the Resurrection. (If the weather is threatening, look for the lights in the sanctuary; if they're on, we'll celebrate indoors.)

Easter Morning - 10 a.m., March 31

At 10:00 a.m. we'll rejoice in the Risen Christ with word and song in the sanctuary. Officiating will be Reverend Barbara Toll of the New York Conference, UCC. Rev. Toll has been assisting our minister search team, and we look forward to celebrating the Resurrection with her this Easter morning.

A Maundy Thursday Service of Shadows (that you can do at home)

Mt. Sinai Congregational Church has traditionally commemorated Maundy Thursday with an evening worship service and Communion. This year, with-

out a minister, the Worship and Sacraments Board is offering you a way to honor the day at home with a "Service of Shadows," or *Tenebrae*.

We suggest you set aside a time to have a meal with family, or friends, or by yourself *before* the Service of Shadows. We've included a prayer to begin the meal if you wish to use it. You can access it <u>here</u>

We are mindful that the word, "communion" shares its root with "community." So, even alone, you can be assured that there are communities of faith the world over who are sharing a holy meal with you on this Maundy Thursday.

What you'll need for the Service of Shadows:

- A room or area in a room where lights can be dimmed; a space where you will be comfortable.
- Six "shadow candles" and one Christ candle with candle holders for all seven. Candles and candle holders need not be uniform.
- A Bible. If you are using a hard copy, bookmark the readings before you begin. If you'd like to use an online Bible site, we recommend using <u>biblegateway.com</u> and selecting the New Revised Standard Version Updated Edition. You can then enter the scripture reference and go directly to that selection in that translation.
- The order of the readings and prayers, which you can access <u>here</u>. If you're with a group, you might plan who will read each passage so the service will flow freely through the sections. Alternatively, you may simply leave that to the moving of the Spirit.

Be sure to honor the silence after extinguishing each candle. Let it last, maybe even longer than you're comfortable with.

Sunday School Update

We have been continuing our new initiative of looking at different religious practices around the world. On the first Sunday of each month both Sunday School classes combine for a multi-age experience exploring traditions and traits of different religions through music, art, dance, readings, prayers, play etc.

During Lent and Easter, our children have been learning about this important part of our faith. The younger Sunday School class has been enjoying "Brain Breaks" provided by Ms. Caroline.

The older children have been using the Big Room downstairs for the Lenten Season. There is a 40 step hopscotch board outlined on the floor that is used in each Sunday during Lent along with a 40 day poster calendar displayed on the wall with a scripture for each of the 40 days. They students look up the verses and draw an illustration or symbol of the scripture for that day on the calendar.

Both activities are helping our children understand this important time of the year while enjoying themselves in engaging activities.

Share the Light – One Great Hour of Sharing

Pax Christi Lenten Effort

The Pax Christi Hospitality Center in Port Jefferson is a crisis homeless shelter for men. A part of the Hope House Ministries, Pax Christi was established in 1991 by Father Francis Pizzarelli in response to the death of a homeless man found near the railroad tracks in the Port Jefferson area.

The Center provides emergency services to men over 16. They are open 24/7,

and under staff supervision at all times. In addition to providing basic necessities, such as a meal, clothing and a place to shower and sleep, they provide supportive assistance to help guests connect to services in the community than can meet their needs.

As a Lenten effort this year, *Missions* is organizing a men's underwear collection for the guests of Pax Christi. All sizes of men's briefs or boxers are requested. <u>Donations must be brand new, in an unopened package</u>. A collection bin has been set up in Voorhees Hall for your donations. Donations will be accepted through Easter Sunday.

Please consider providing a small comfort to these unsheltered individuals. Your donation is greatly appreciated.

Join us for a Sunday afternoon retreat exploring Rembrandt's remarkable painting known as

The Return of the Prodigal Son. Based on Jesus's famous parable in Luke 15:11-32, Rembrandt's painting is a masterpiece that beautifully depicts the characters and events in the parable. At the same time, the painting helps us see this parable through the artist's eyes, with the insights and details that make it come to life. The painting is also an invitation to see stories within the main story, each of which help us make a

more personal connection to this timeless teaching about penitence, forgiveness, and celebration.

The retreat will include guided observation of the Rembrandt painting, small group time, personal reflection, and a simple art activity. (One needn't be an artist to participate!) The retreat is designed to help us encounter this scripture afresh and be steeped for a while in the ways



of God's love. And there will be good fellowship and creative fun along the way! If possible,



GET READY FOR THE BIG CLOTHING DRIVE IN MAY

The Strategic Planning Action Committee (SPAC) will host a clothing fundraiser on May 5th. Please start saving the following items:

Clothing, shoes, handbags, backpacks, stuffed animals, small, single item, plastic toys (NO PUZZLES, BOARD GAMES, LEGOS OR TOYS WITH PIECES) and linens including towels, curtains and table linens (NO BLANKETS OR COMFORTERS)

Please put all items in kitchen size garbage bags. The company pays 20 cents per pound up to 10,000 lbs. (100 bags = about 2,000 lbs.) and 25 cents for each pound over 10,000.

If you can, please keep your donations at home until May 5th. If you don't have space at home, you can bring your donations to church, and put them in the closet in the middle of the big room in the basement.
