Moderator's Message

On October 29th we held a budget review meeting that presented proposed budget materials for 2024 and, in a first, the next five years. The attendance was outstanding and much was reviewed and discussed.

Our church is on multiple journeys simultaneously. One journey is on a road that leads to a selection and call to a minister who we pray holds the same hopes, dreams and expectations that align with what our church is hoping when considering the future. The second road provides a challenging journey into new and unexplored territo-

ry. It centers on improved communication, engagement, and interaction with the communities we serve, and identifying strategies for improved financial stability. Both roads do in fact

come together at some point. And although we may not have the foresight to know when that merge will take place, as church, we continue to move down the road in faith and with focused actions.

When considering our minister search journey, it needs to be known that the nine individuals that make up the Search Committee have been and continue to be diligent, dedicated, and willing to do what it takes to get the task accomplished. Part of their work on the Local Church Profile included preparing a proposed minister compensation package and assessing its effect on the church's overall budget before moving ahead.

After many meetings and discussions within the Search Committee and with the Finance Board, it was determined that the church's financial strength would only allow us to pursue a parttime minister at this time. This was announced at a meeting in September. Now that we are weeks into our stewardship campaign, our understanding has improved regarding our resources. As you know, our finances were greatly impacted by events of the past four years and prior economic downturns. Therefore, it has been decided that it is time to restore a balance to our budget. Information regarding this will be formally presented and voted on at the Annual Meeting on November 5th.

Our parallel journey is one that requires navigating a road that has many twists, turns, successes and failures. It centers on our financial stability. This journey requires a concentrated

> effort to identify new and unthought of income opportunities for the church, and provide a strategy that will result in a successful implementation. Towards this end, a new action team

has been formed to work on strategic planning and income generation. The <u>Strategic Planning</u> <u>Action Team</u> will report to the Finance Board whose lead will in turn bring findings and opportunities to Church Council. This is not something that has been done before. If you would like to be a part of it, please let me know.

As we draw closer to the end of yet another year, I can't help but be totally optimistic for the prospects of 2024 and beyond for our church community and mission. You make the difference. It is through the dedication and combination of each of our God-given gifts that gives us the assurance of a successful journey.


